

FIGURE 3: PROGRAMME NOMINAL ALLOCATIONS FY 2017/18 (UGX BILLION)






FIGURE 4: PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN PROGRAMME NOMINAL ALLOCATIONS BETWEEN FY 2016/17 & FY 2017/18
